WATER! WATER! EVERYWHERE BUT NOT A DROP TO DRINK!

Michael Fidler, the Director and Vice President, of non-profit Intelligentsia International, Inc., LaBelle, Florida and Martina Frycova, President of the Rotaract Club (Rotaract is a Rotary-sponsored service club for young men and women ages 18 to 30) of Pilsen, Czech Republic came to speak to us about Rotary Clubs involvement with clean water and sanitation projects worldwide. In Michal's position with Intelligentsia and as a Rotarian, he has traveled throughout the world working on and assessing on-going water projects along with the viability of future Rotary projects. Intelligentsia's President and founder, John Capece also happens to be our Rotary District 6960 Water Project Chair. Although Intelligentsia's focus is the US through work on sustainable biomass production, energy analysis and life cycle assessment, water treatment and utilities, energy technologies & climate change, policies instrumentation, technology & technical research international development and humanitarian service, environmental advocacy, hydraulic and ecological restoration community service and recreation; their expertise regarding viable water projects can be applied anywhere.

Fidler considers himself a Rotary Vagabond and has traveled the world working on Rotary water projects and experiencing Rotary clubs in the US, Asia, Africa and Europe. Between 2005 and 2007 his assignment included a two year stay in Tajikistan where he supervised the construction of all drinking water projects. He was part of a group that established that nation's first Rotary Club. He spent six months on a visit to India and made an assessment as to viability of projects there; his comments were rivers are so polluted and corruption so deep, that at this time projects are not feasible. Michal also spent some time checking on water-well projects in Afghanistan, he felt that the rough terrain and continuing military efforts slowed down these projects but the future of these projects could be sustainable. Area terrain is a large factor in water project success; snow-capped mountains provide water but the challenge is to bring that water down the mountains to the arid villages. Other countries deal with polluted water sources and sanitation efforts to provide a clean water source.

Rotary International has made clean wa-

ter and sanitation a major focus of their service projects throughout the world and is now focusing in on the sustainable future of these projects. Intelligentsia International helps them assess viability.

Martina is now serving as an intern with Intelligentsia. Rotary brings a college student to the US for a three to six month internship, where they will help organize Rotary water grant projects, learn about the technical design of water supply and treatment systems, and then cap off the experience with a rail tour-Rail & Water Tour- of the US. Since 1999 Intelligentsia has hosted more than 300 students for various technical internships. Interns travel on AMTRAK, are hosted by Rotary families, and present a program that explains about the need for clean water in developing countries and how Rotary water projects help deliver sustainable solutions. The cost of this travel is somewhere around \$2,000 per intern and Martina came to explain the program to us and ask for our support. Intelligentsia has introduced hundreds of students to Rotary service projects. Some of these students have gone on to careers in humanitarian water projects, serving over half a million people.
